 - NO DOG** may be permanently removed from the show before it is judged, except by the consent of the Show Secretary upon a Veterinarian's recommendation of removal.
 - There is no provision for unentered dogs at this show
 - Dogs which according to their owner's records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed Competition, provided this transfer is made by the Show Secretary at least one half hour prior to the start of the regular conformation judging.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Single Dog Entries

Veteran Dog* (For Boxers [g] years of age and older on the day of the show) **Veteran Bitch***

BEST OF BREED COMPETITION

Best of Breed Competition - The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed competition. Dogs that are Champions of Record. Dogs which according to their owner's records have completed the requirements for a championship but whose championships are unconfirmed. The entry and showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owner's records. If, at the end of the 90-day period, the championship of a dog has not been confirmed by the American Kennel Club, no further entries of the dog for Best of Breed competition are to be made until its championship has been confirmed by the AKC.

Grand Champion Select - When quality warrants, after BOB and BOS to BOB are awarded, a Select Dog (SD) and Select Bitch (SB) may be chosen from the remaining Champions. Non-Regular Class winners that are Champions and qualify for BOB are eligible. WD or WB are NOT eligible. (AKC Dog Show Rules, Chapter 3, Section 14 effective 5/12/10).

Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries

Stud Dog Class* - For dogs that have sired two dogs or bitches entered in this show. The award will be based on the merits of the get. The owner of the stud dog need not be the owner of the get. As the judge's decision in this class will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class. The Stud Dog must appear in the ring with his get and be entered in the Stud Dog Class.

Brood Bitch Class* - For bitches that have whelped two dogs or bitches entered in this show. The award will be based on the merits of the produce. The owner of the brood bitch need not be the owner of the produce. As the judge's decision in this class will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class. The Brood Bitch must appear in the ring with her produce and be entered in the Brood Bitch Class.
 *Chapter 11, Section 8 of the Dog Show Rules provides that "a castrated male may be entered as Stud Dog. In the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class" and Neutered dogs and spayed bitches would be allowed to compete in the Veterans classes only at independent specialties and/or those all-breed shows which do not offer any competitive classes beyond "Best of Breed."

BEST PUPPY

The first place puppy in each of the four puppy classes is eligible to compete for this award.

Beginner Novice Class. Any dog/handler that has never titled in AKC Obedience may enter the Beginner Novice "A" class. If a dog/handler has ever earned an AKC Obedience title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD) they must compete in the Beginner Novice "B" class. Handlers and dogs that have earned a Beginner Novice title from the "A" class and have no other AKC obedience titles are still eligible for the Regular Novice "A" class in obedience.

Non-Regular Classes

* * **Pre-Novice:** The Pre-Novice class shall be conducted in accord with AKC rules and regulations.

Graduate Novice: The Graduate Novice class shall be for CD dogs that have not been certified by a Judge to have received a Qualifying Score toward a CDX title prior to the closing of entries. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may handle more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the Long Sit and Long Down exercises when judged in the same group. Dogs entered in Graduate Novice may also be entered in one of the Open classes.

Veterans: The Veterans class shall be for dogs that have an obedience title and are seven or more years old on the date of the trial. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice class. Dogs entered in the Veterans class may not be entered in any Regular class.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

Novice Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

* Each dog handled in a Junior Showmanship Class must be entered in one of the Breed or Obedience Classes at the show, or must be entered for Junior Showmanship only. However, a dog may be substituted. Such substitution must be accompanied by an official AKC entry form. All such substitutions must be made one half hour prior to the judging of any Junior Showmanship Classes at the show. Each dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior Handler or by the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfater or grandmother, including step and half relations or by a member of the Junior Handler's household. Every dog entered for Junior Showmanship must be eligible to compete in Dog Shows or in Obedience Trials. **BITCHES**

IN SEASON ARE NOT ELIGIBLE. A dog that has been excused or disqualified by a Breed Judge or by a Bench Show Committee may still be handled in Junior Showmanship if eligible to compete in Obedience Trials. A dog that has been rejected, dismissed, or excused by the Veterinarian for the protection of the other dogs at the show or for the protection of the dog excused may not be handled in Junior Showmanship.

* Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition present after the closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of any regular conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier.

* Winning of first place in an Open Class at this show may qualify or count toward qualification for entry in certain future limited Junior Showmanship Classes. For information on eligibility requirements for limited Junior Showmanship Classes which have been approved to date by AKC, write to the American Kennel Club, Show Plans, P.O. Box 900051, Raleigh, NC 27675.

* Junior Handlers must include their AKC Junior Handler identification number on the entry blank. You may obtain your number by calling the AKC Event Records Department (919) 233-9767.

* Notice: Be sure all information for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on the front and back of the entry form.

SWEEPSTAKES

Classes: Each age group is divided by sex:

6 months - under 9 months: 9 months - under 12 months; 12 months under 18 months
Sweepstakes entry fee is \$18.00

CONDITIONS

Sweepstakes will be judged before the Veteran Sweepstakes. Entries are open to non-members as well as members. *Entries in the Sweepstakes must also be entered in a regular class and entries must be made at the same time as regular entries and must be on the same entry blank under "Additional Classes."* Champions of Record are not eligible to compete.

Two (2) Stakes will be created for the Sweepstakes:

1. One exclusively for Puppy Competition 2. One exclusively for Junior Competition
Sweepstakes entry fees received for Puppy Classes will become part of the Stake for Puppy Competition ONLY after deduction of 30% for sweepstakes expenses. The above applies to Junior Competition as well, with total monies received from donations to be divided equally between Puppy and Junior Sweepstakes Classes. In the event there are no entries in the designated classes, the percentage shares of stake for that class shall be divided equally among the other classes.

The Puppy Competition Classes and Cash Stakes will be divided as follows:

OWNER of BEST PUPPY (6 to 9 months) DOG & BITCH - 20% each
OWNER of BEST PUPPY (9 to 12 months) DOG & BITCH - 20% each
OWNER of BEST PUPPY in PUPPY CLASSES - 20% each

The Junior Competition Classes and Cash Stakes will be divided as follows:

OWNER of BEST JUNIOR (12 to 18 months) DOG & BITCH - 33% each
OWNER of BEST IN JUNIOR CLASSES - 33% each

BEST IN PUPPY SWEEPSTAKES WINNER will compete against the BEST IN JUNIOR SWEEPSTAKES for GRAND SWEEPSTAKES WINNER

VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

Classes: Each age group is divided by sex:

6 years - under 8 years: 8 years - under 10 years; Over 10 years
Sweepstakes entry fee is \$18.00

CONDITIONS

Veteran Sweepstakes will be judged after the Regular Sweepstakes and before the Specialty. Entries are open to non-members as well as members. *Entries in the Veteran Sweepstakes need not be entered in a regular class;* however, entries must be made at the same time as regular entries and must be on the same entry blank under "Additional Classes. Champions of Record are eligible to compete. *Neutered Dogs and Spayed Bitches are eligible to compete.*

Two Stakes will be created for the Veteran Sweepstakes:

1. One exclusively for Junior Competition (6 to 10 years)
2. One exclusively for Senior Competition (Over 10 years)
Sweepstakes entry fees received for Junior Classes will become part of the Stake for Junior Competition only after deduction of 30% for sweepstakes expenses. The above applies to Senior Competition as well, with total monies received from donations to be divided equally between Junior and Senior Sweepstakes Classes. In the event there are no entries in the designated classes, the percentage shares of stake for that class shall be divided equally among the other classes.

The Junior Competition Classes and Cash Stakes will be divided as follows:

OWNER of BEST JUNIOR (6 to 8 years) DOG & BITCH - 20% each
OWNER of BEST JUNIOR (8 to 10 years) DOG & BITCH - 20% each
OWNER of the BEST in JUNIOR VETERAN CLASSES - 20%

The Senior Competition Classes and Cash Stakes will be divided as follows:

OWNER of BEST SENIOR (Over 10 years) DOG & BITCH - 33% each
OWNER of BEST in SENIOR VETERAN CLASSES - 33%

BEST in JUNIOR VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES WINNER will compete against the BEST in SENIOR VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES WINNER for GRAND VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES WINNER

- The Boxer Club of San Fernando Valley, Inc. and its members assume no responsibility for loss, damage or injury to any person, animal or property during activities connected with events of this Show. Exhibitors and handlers are encouraged to secure their valuables at all times.
- **THIS IS A SELF-CLEANING EVENT** and clean-up equipment is provided. Any exhibitor observed failing to clean up may be subject to disciplinary action.
- Two wheeled scooters, motorized or other, are not allowed on the Fairgrounds. FOR YOUR SAFETY, NO STROLLERS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE JUDGING BUILDINGS. NO TWO WHEEL VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED. Note: Two wheel vehicles do not qualify as a disabled person's vehicle.

SETUPS AND GROOMING

- OUTDOOR SETUPS are permitted only beyond 10 feet of all show rings and where they do not cause congestion or block access to the rings. Safety regulations and limited space prohibit setups in day-of-show parking lots.
- INSIDE ANACAPA AND SAN MIGUEL HALLS (judging buildings) all setups must be within areas bounded by walls and the taped line. To accommodate as many exhibitors as possible, only one exercise pen is permitted per setup. BLOW DRYERS OR VACUUMS are NOT ALLOWED to be used in these buildings, nor may dogs be left there overnight.
- GROOMING AREAS are provided in Santa Cruz Hall where power is adequate for blowers. This building is designated solely for grooming and setups. It is not available for other functions such as group lunches, raffish and club meetings.
- A DOG BATHING AREA is provided by the El Camarino Real Summerfest Cluster and is located outside (Southwest side) Santa Cruz Hall. Tubs are provided and must not be moved from this area. Please use water shut-offs after bathing your dog. NO BATHING OF DOGS WILL BE ALLOWED IN ANY OTHER AREA. EXHIBITORS FOUND BATHING THEIR DOGS IN OTHER AREAS WILL BE SUBJECT TO A BENCH SHOW COMMITTEE.

4. During the hours of judging, owners are to be on call and have their dogs ready to bring into the judging ring promptly in order that the judging will not be delayed. Dogs need only be present for their judging. Dogs not needed for further judging may be excused. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his dog ready to be shown and at the entrance of the judging ring when the steward calls for the class. Owners of dogs or the handlers of the dogs alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings. This means it is not the responsibility of the ring steward, nor of any agent of the show-giving club to locate any dog, its owner or handler, when the dog's presence is needed in a judging ring. It should be understood by every exhibitor and handler that waiting for dogs to be brought into the ring is a courtesy extended to the owner or handler of the dog. There is no rule of this club nor of The American Kennel Club that requires a judge to wait for an owner or handler to bring his dog into the ring. Show hours 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
5. Trophies and prizes will be awarded in the judging ring before the completion of the judging of the breed and the Superintendent's office advised at once, in the event of any discrepancy. All trophies must be claimed the day of the show. None will be mailed.
6. Exhibitors are admonished to make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this premium list. Rule books are available online at www.akc.org.
7. The club, its superintendents or their employees will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any dog exhibited, whether the result of accident or other causes and in addition assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by an exhibitor or handler. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this show is in the care, custody and control of its owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises.
8. No grooming tables, pens or exhibitors setups will be allowed in the aisles and all grooming must be done away from the judging ring in areas specified by the club.

Dogs which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed or Variety Competition, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half hour prior to the start of the earliest Conformation Judging at the Show.
16. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class after the closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of the earliest conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier.
17. Dogs which according to their owners' records have earned an obedience or rally title after the closing of entries for the show may be moved up to the next class, provided this transfer is made in writing and presented to the superintendent at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial.
18. Practicing is not allowed in rings at any time.
